A Second Chance at Life

In coordination between the Syrian German Medical Association (SGMA) , Molham Team and the Barada Association.

Background:

The healthcare system in Syria suffers from a severe lack of infrastructure and a critical shortage of essential medical devices and equipment. A delegation from the Syrian German Medical Association witnessed this shortage firsthand during their visit to Syria. They held meetings with officials from the Ministry of Health and conducted field visits to hospitals.

This shortage also extends to the intensive care sector, where patients face life-threatening situations due to the extreme lack of ventilators, making it impossible to provide them with the necessary respiratory support.



Objective:

- Based on these urgent needs, the "New Hope" donation campaign has been launched to support these two critical sectors and to help alleviate a small part of the overwhelming demand.
- The campaign aims to raise **€200,000** with the potential to expand depending on response and donation volume.
- The funds will be used to purchase dialysis machines and ventilators. In coordination with the Syrian Ministry of Health, the exact type of required equipment will be determined. A price comparison between different manufacturers in Germany and abroad will be conducted to ensure the optimal use of donated funds.

Organizing Institutions:



1. **Syrian German Medical Association:** A newly established, non-profit organization that brings together healthcare professionals in Germany and Syria. The association is in the process of registration and aims to support the healthcare sector in Syria while fostering collaboration between medical professionals in both countries.



2. **Molham Volunteer Team:** A volunteer team founded in 2012 that works on securing and distributing humanitarian aid across various regions of Syria. It relies on funding from individual donors worldwide and has carried out large fundraising campaigns that have resulted in numerous developmental projects.



3. **Barada Association:** A registered non-profit organization in Germany, founded in 2012. It is dedicated to providing humanitarian aid to the Syrian people across all communities.

Campaign Duration:

The campaign will initially run until the end of March, with the possibility of extension if needed.

Implementation Strategy:

A committee has been formed, consisting of members from the coordinating body of the German-Syrian Medical Association. The responsibilities of this committee include:

1. Promoting the campaign and mobilizing the necessary support.
2. Communicating with the relevant authorities in the Syrian Ministry of Health to assess needs and ensure a transparent and effective implementation.
3. Overseeing the purchase and distribution of medical equipment, ensuring maximum benefit from the donations.
4. Ensuring complete transparency by providing regular reports to donors on the spending process and the progress of purchasing and distributing the devices.
